Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)
A SAFE AND GRADUAL RESUMPTION OF SPORT & FITNESS ACTIVITIES

Q1: Who will have to undergo the Fast & Easy Testing (FET)?

Ans: As of 18 February 2022, all workforce¹ (include full-time/part-time workers such as instructors, coaches, cleaners, administrative staff, etc in the Sport & Fitness sector will no longer be required to continue Fast and Easy Test (FET) Rostered Routine Testing (RRT) regime.

Those who are employed by or as third-party vendors in entities eg. preschools, early intervention centres, and private education institutions catering to vulnerable groups such as children below 5 years old, will still be subjected to FET RRT. Those that conduct their own classes for less than 5-year olds outside these mentioned settings, would not be required to do RRT.

Q2: How will the FET be conducted?

Ans: ***Sport & Fitness businesses and Self-employed persons (SEPs) and small businesses*** that are employed by or as third-party vendors in entities eg. preschools, early intervention centres, and private education institutions are to conduct Employer-Supervised Self-Swab (ESSS) subsumed under the above mentioned entities' nominal roll. 
Q3: Who bears the cost of the Antigen Rapid Test (ART) kits?

Ans: The costs for the Antigen Rapid Test (ART) kits stated in Q1 will be borne by the Government. Kits will be made available to third-party vendors through the entities eg. preschools, early intervention centres, and private education institutions. Refer to MOE [link](#).

Q4: How do I check for the test results?

Ans: You will receive a SMS to notify you of the result within 1 hour.





Q5: What should I do if I have a POSTIVE ART result?

Ans: Please abide by the prevailing management postures for such cases that are set out on MOH's website at <https://www.moh.gov.sg/>.

Q6: What should I do if I have an INVALID ART result?

Ans: An invalid test may mean that the test was not performed correctly. Please perform another ART immediately.

Q7: What should I do if I have a second INVALID ART result?

If you do not have any symptoms such as fever, cough, sore throat, breathlessness etc. Please self-isolate for 72 hours & subsequently self-administer a second ART (unsupervised) with your own kit. If it is negative, you may proceed to work. If it is positive, please abide by the prevailing management postures for such cases that are set out on MOH's website at <https://www.moh.gov.sg/>.

If you have symptoms such as fever, cough, sore throat, breathlessness etc, visit a Swab and Send Home (SASH) clinic at <https://flu.gowhere.gov.sg> via private transport for a doctor to assess and advise you on your next steps.
