Dr Tan Eng Liang is the Vice President of the Singapore National Olympic Council (SNOC) and Chairman of the Special Training Assistance in SNOC. He was the first Rhodes Scholar from Singapore, Malaya and Brunei, and has held several other leading corporate and government positions, including being the Senior Minister of State for National Development from 1975 to 1978, Senior Minister of State for Finance from 1978 to 1979, and Chairman of the Singapore Sports Council from 1975 to 1991. He also sits on the board of several public listed companies in Singapore.

Dr Tan has won numerous awards and national honours, including the Public Service Star (BBM) in 1971, Public Service Star (BAR) in 1985, and the Meritorious Service Medal in 1991. He was also the Chef de Mission for the 2008 Beijing Olympic Games.
