Celebrate The Extraordinary as One Team Singapore

Held on 3 October 2017 at Swissôtel The Stamford, the "Celebrate The Extraordinary" event was organized (with the support from adidas, Deloitte, Fullerton Health, OSIM and Swissôtel) to recognise the achievements and extraordinary spirit of our athletes. More than 100 corporate representatives and 80 athletes gathered to commemorate Singapore contingent's best home away games performance, with a total of 188 medals (57 Gold, 58 Silver and 73 Bronze)! An astonishing feat for a small country like ours indeed!

Key announcements at the event included the official launch of the One Team Singapore fund (OTSF), where Corporates and individuals can now play a direct role in cultivating the future generation of sporting heroes. The fund supports High Performance Sport in various,



areas such as coach development competition opportunities, sport science and medicine etc.

During the event, the OTSF received its first group of donations from running club Tiong Bahru Garden Joggers (\$100,000) and *spex*Business partner, Deloitte Singapore (\$150,000). Inspired by Deloitte, Fullerton Health also

Internships, contract and full-time employment opportunities were made available at the session.








spexEducation-In-Focus

Besides *spex*Business partners providing support to Team Singapore athletes, *spex*Education partners also continuously garner their strong support towards student-athletes in their community. This issue's highlight:



Other than the School of Business Management, Nanyang Polytechnic has now expanded the *spex*Education scheme to all their schools.

What this means is that now there will be more athlete-friendly educational courses made available for our student-athletes.



SIM Global Education, in collaboration with the University of Stirling, have also expanded from 1 to 4 athlete-friendly courses.

Student-athletes can now enrol in any of these four courses:

- Bachelor of Arts (Honours) in Sports Studies and Marketing
- Bachelor of Arts (Honours) in Sport Business Management
- Bachelor of Arts (Honours) in Sustainable Events Management
- Bachelor of Arts (Honours) in Retail Marketing

SIM Global Education also offer 8 scholarships which sponsors 50% of the programme fee over 2 academic years - 2018/2019 (4 scholarships) and 2019/2020 (4 scholarships) for national athletes to pursue the above programmes. Scholarship applications will open in Feb/Mar 2018.

Team Singapore Takes 1,336 Steps Towards a Sportier Singapore

The Swissôtel Vertical Marathon was held on 19 November with more than 2,000 participants, including several Team Singapore athletes, who scaled 73 storeys to reach the peak of one of Southeast Asia's tallest hotels.



TeamSG rowers Saiyidah Aisyah and Syahir Rafa'ee, golfers Gregory Foo and Jerome Ng, track and field athlete Jackie Chionh, and shooter Alvina Neo took part in the race, while sprint legend U.K. Shyam and wushu exponent Tan Xiang Tian gave out medals to winners from



several categories.

Para-athletes Jackie and Alvina, had successfully conquered the Swissôtel Vertical Marathon seventh and eighth time respectively. Taking on the arduous challenge despite their physical limitations was their way of proving that getting active could be a way of life for everyone. "I want to show people that people with disabilities can actually do things [in] the same [way] or even better than ablebodied people. To me, disability doesn't

stop me, it makes me challenge the impossible," said Jackie, who depended solely on the strength of his left arm and leg to complete the 73-storey challenge.

To assist more Singaporeans to take greater ownership and responsibility

for their health, an Active Health booth was also set up on the event day. The



booth comprised of stations where participants could obtain information on their body composition and BMI. The handgrip strength test that measures the static strength of the hand and forearm, and also predicting the functional status of older adults is also made available.

Team Singapore Archer, Christina Gunawan, only started Archery when she was 17 years old. Nevertheless, she picked up the sport really quickly and even represented Singapore for SEA Games 2015, her first ever major game. For Christina, it was a

tough period then as she had to juggle between school and sport. Thankfully she had the support of NTU, *spex*Education partner, who provided her with leaves of absence as well as making exceptions to bring her exams a week forward so that she could concentrate and compete for SEA Games 2015.

Fast forward 2 years later, Christina is now currently working in KPMG, our *spex*Business partner. Christina first found out about the job through a *spex*Business networking session.



Additionally, she received constant support from KPMG where she received a month of Full Pay Unrecorded Leave (FPUL), a month of sabbatical leave and 10 days of additional paid leave to train and compete for SEA Games 2017. OLY post-nominal letters to honour Olympians

On 11 November 2017, World Olympians Association (WOA) unveiled its landmark OLY post-nominal letters initiative at the 8th International Olympic Committee (IOC) International Athletes' Forum in Lausanne. The initiative allows all Olympians around the world to sign-up through WOA to use "OLY" after their names, in a similar fashion to other post-nominal designations such as PhD.

Serving as a symbolic recognition of an Olympian's status in society, the OLY lettering will help to promote an Olympian's social, charitable, professional and community-based work, acting as a unifying reminder of their achievements and responsibility to embody the values of Olympism in everyday life. The OLY lettering offers Olympians:

- A professional tool, showing off the highly transferable skills of being an Olympian and competing at the highest level
- A symbol of their dedication, concentration and commitment to sport and success
- A link to the global network of Olympians

As shared by WOA President, Joël Bouzou, Olympians have achieved something unique by participating at an Olympic Games, and for that they must be recognised. Olympians are truly leaders and role models in society and ambassadors of the Olympic Movement. Much like a doctor, a lawyer or a university professor, becoming an Olympian takes many years of hard work and requires a diverse range of skills. This initiative will provide Olympians with the professional recognition they deserve.
