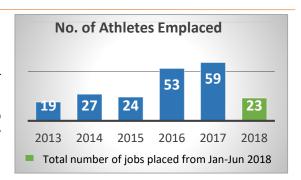

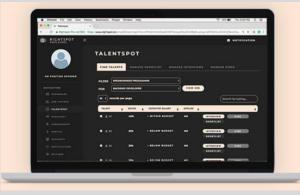




# New and Improved Rightspot Features

# SSI-RP Certification in Athlete Life Coaching





Athlete Life Coaching is a specialised field of counselling that helps athletes proactively plan for all other areas of their life while they pursue sports. Athletes will be better guided on decisions for major timelines and milestones as they continue

to progress and develop their best potential in sport.

Republic Polytechnic and Singapore Sport Institute have come together to offer the Athlete Life Coaching course that aims to equip sport practitioners with the necessary skill sets to effectively and holistically manage athletes whom they mentor and guide.

The course to be launched soon in September is targeted at personnel who interact frequently with athletes, usually student life officers from institutes of higher education, sport coaches, teachers managing Sport CCAs and NSA staff.

With athlete life coaching guidance:

- Athletes will receive timely support in making important decisions along their sport development pathway.
- Athletes will stay longer in the sport and be more likely to reach their best sporting achievements.
- There will be less talent attrition which will directly impact the talent pool available for development to the higher levels of achievements.

Griselda represented Singapore at the 2016 Rio Olympics, where she finished 15<sup>th</sup> overall and was placed the top Asian in the world. #### Team Singapore Bowler Mohamed Ismail Bin Hussain

took part in his first international ablebodied competition earlier this month, and the experience left him eager for more.



Ismail (pictured) won the Gold in the Mixed Singles TP3 event at the 2017 ASEAN Para Games in KL.

The 34-year-old, who usually bowls under the TPB3 category for the visually-impaired, was at the PBF 2nd Philippines International Open 2018 in Manila, where he competed against able-bodied bowlers for the first time in his sporting career.

"The plan for me to take part together with the able-bodied [athletes] was actually to test my mental strength. so that when I bowl on the bigger stage in paracompetitions, I won't feel [too] pressured," he said.

However, he was caught off guard by how quickly things unfolded on the day of the competition.

"Normally, we get 5 to 10 minutes of practice before we even start [competing]. During that first 10 minutes at the Open, I was already losing my breath because the pace was very fast!" Ismail revealed.

Ismail managed to get used to the faster pace by the third day of the week-long event, eventually even making it into the finals, which saw him compete against the top 24 out of the original 60 participants.

The recent experience in Manila has helped Ismail to realise that visual impairment would not get in the way of a potential bowling career.

Empowered by his experience in Manila, Ismail will head for his second able-bodied competition (44<sup>th</sup> Hong Kong International Open) in late June, after which his focus will be on the Asian Para Games in Jakarta, Indonesia this October. As Ismail continues to challenge the limits in his bowling journey, let us cheer him on as #OneTeamSG!
